The Family Place, in partnership with Campbell Page have been funded by Resilience NSW, to undertake a series of community art installations throughout the Eurobodalla to support wellbeing and recovery after the devastating impacts of the Black Summer.

The Love Hope Renewal project is funded for 18 months with art projects expected to commence in October and be finalised by December 2022.

Disaster recovery expert Dr Rob Gordon's findings indicate that art in its many forms and community gatherings, have proven valuable in healing and moving forward from disaster. The sustained impacts of covid have inhibited the healing and recovery process that would normally occur, making these wellbeing initiatives even more critical for our community.
